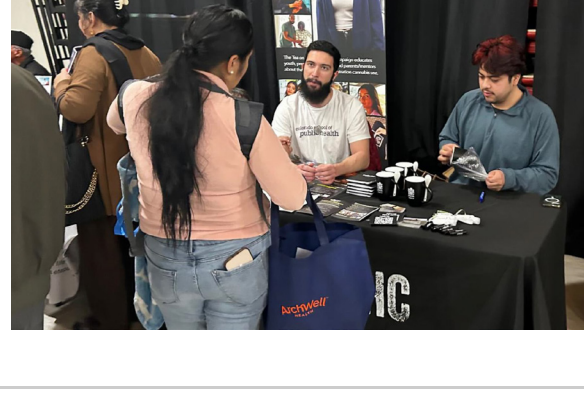
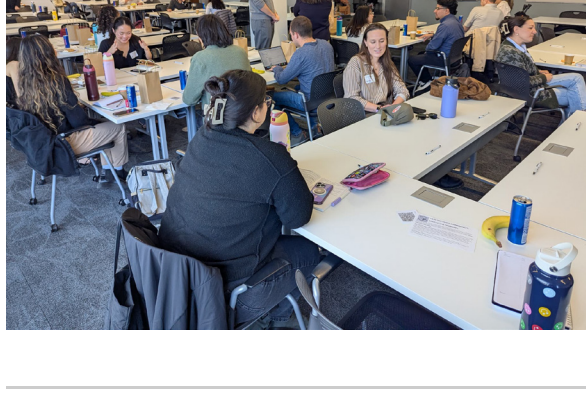
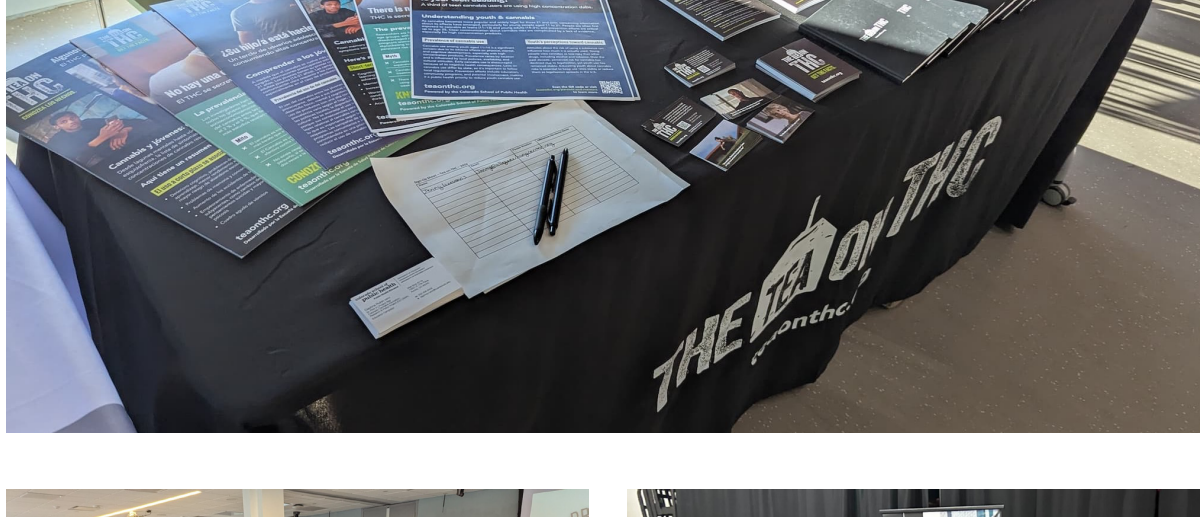


Where We've Been and Where We're Going

From Capitol Hill to local health fairs, we've been out in the community sharing resources, raising awareness, and connecting with people where they are.

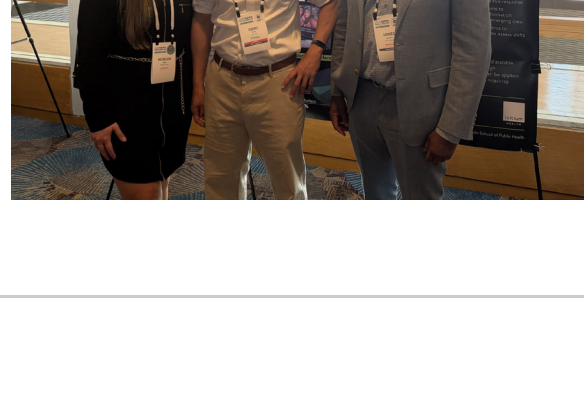
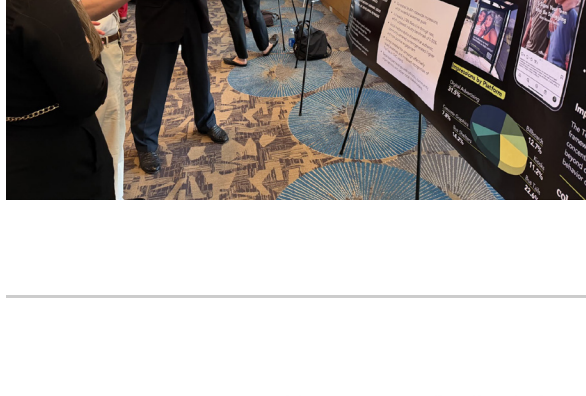
